"OF NOTE THIS WEEK"

November 11 - Armistice Day/Remembrance Day/Veterans' Day

At the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918, the armistice – laying down of arms – was signed to end the First World War. Many nations continue to call this Armistice Day, while others name it Remembrance, recalling the sacrifice made by men and women in both World War I – "the war to end all wars" – and the many wars that have and continue to take place.

In many countries around the world, people observe two minutes of silence at 11 a.m. on November 11, and people will contemplate horrors of war and the desire for peace.

Churches in Canada and the UK often observe the Sunday prior to November 11 as Remembrance Sunday with special prayers, hymns, and commemorations of those who were involved in war, and prayers for ways to work for peace.

November 12 - Baha'u'llah's Birthday (Baha'i)

The birthday of the founder of the Baha'i faith is often observed with prayers, feasts, and community activities. Baha'u'llah was born in Nur, Persia, in 1817.
