Dear Mr. Miller:

The Board of Management of Sharon Church met in regular session last evening, and among other items of business discussed, the question of financing the Church for 1930 was seriously considered, and in view of the obligations which the Church is faced in the coming year, it is with regret that I am obliged to advise you that it will be necessary to decrease your salary as Organist, from \$75.00 to \$58.33 per month, dating from January 1st, 1930.


It is the wish of the Board that you understand that the matter is entirely one of financial stringency. Your interest in your work for the Church is sincerely appreciated.

You are aware that about a year ago two of the Managers took over the duties of Treasurer, without cost to the Church, simply because we could not afford to pay the salary that the previous Treasurer received on her retirement. In addition to this, further economy is in process of being carried out. I mention this in order that you will not feel that you have been unjustly dealt with.

In the event of you not seeing your way clear to accept this reduction in salary, kindly notify me immediately, as it will then be necessary for the Board to call for "tenders" for an Organist.
