Her faithfulness, her influence, and her gifts shall not be forgotten by those who knew her,

The Sunday-school is making splendid progress. For this improvement much credit must be given to the efficient staff of officers and teachers,

For the Forward Movement St. John Church was asked for \$1500,00. Many of our people thought this too much. But the loyal people of the Kirk rose to the occasion and subscribed over \$3200,00. The report to-night will show that two-thirds of this amount is paid.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was observed four times in the year, at which times twenty-seven united with the church—twenty on confession of faith, and seven by certificate.

The Sacrament of Baptism was administered to twenty. Four of this number belong to other congregations whose pastors were unable to minister at the time.

The Father called Home some of our most active workers, young and older. Their places are hard to fill and they are greatly missed.

We would call attention to the splendid work that Mr, Angus MacKay, the treasurer of the church, is doing gratis. Surely old St. John is very fortunate in its many loyal and faithful workers, who cheerfully give of their time as well as their means.

The Session would also record its appreciation of Mr. Jas. Watters' work with the boys of the church.

In gratitude to God we are going forward to do better in the coming year.

#### REPORT OF MANAGERS.

The Managers are glad to report a splendid year for St. John Church. The various reports to-night will show that our church has raised in the vicinity of \$8 500,00. This is a splendid sum for St. John. It is well, however, that St. John people should bear in mind that much of this money is raised in various ways, and not the direct result of our givings through our current revenue. During the war, and after, "keeping church like keeping house" calls for more money. Our revenue, to meet our increased cost from now on, should be increased through our weekly offerings. We believe the loyal people of the Kirk will do this by increasing their subscriptions.

On the first Sunday in October the Rev. John Pringle, D.D. conducted the Anniversary Service. The special offering for the day amounted to \$680,00.

The beautiful brass Roll of Honor, which was erected by Mrs. Matheson's class in 1917, was completed this year by inserting a memorial tablet. This class also purchased a lantern for the use of the church.

The new piano was paid for by the Sunday School, with the generous donation from the Ladies Aid. Besides this, some gymnasium equipment was purchased consisting of parallel bars, horizonfal bar, mats, clubs and dumbells. The physical culture classes are under the instruction of Mr. James Watters, Jr., assisted by Mr. John Carruthers. There are classes for senior and junior boys as well as for girls.
