

REPORT OF SESSION

The return of our Annual Meeting reminds us that it is the part of wisdom to review the past, and make fresh plans for the New Year.

First of all, we acknowledge with gratitude the good hand of God in the affairs of our church during the year just closed. The services of the sanctuary have been well sustained, and we have enjoyed many seasons of spiritual refreshing.

The various Societies and organizations have their own share in this report, but it is a pleasure to note that the Sunday School with its efficient and self-denying staff of officers and teachers, have had a good year.

Several members of the organized C. G. I. T. and Tuxis and Trail Rangers groups, have had the privilege of attending summer camps, and conferences, rendering themselves thereby, more efficient in the school and bringing inspiration to their companions. The Young People's Society which is made up of the older groups of young men and women in the Sunday School with the officers and teachers, have had an active and interesting series of meetings, and form a connection between the Church and the young people of the surrounding congregations. These meetings are a great stimulus to the social, mental, and devotional life of the young people.

Three of our young men are continuing their studies at the University, looking toward the Christian ministry, and all give promise of useful careers.

The Anniversary Services on Oct. 20th with Rev. J. A. Ramsay of Moncton as special preacher, were well attended, interesting and profitable.

A word of commendation is due to the Choir, for faithful attendance, and the large part they have contributed to our services.

The Communion Roll contains 289 names; forty-one of which are non-resident. Ten have been received into membership, two have been removed by letter, and three have finished their course with joy. We mourn the departure of some of our most faithful and useful members. To the bereaved families we tender our profound sympathy, commending them to the God of all comfort.

The minister has solemnized five marriages, baptized nine and conducted thirteen funerals.

With renewed confidence in God and a greater brotherliness in the congregation let us make 1930 a happier and more prosperous year.

REPORT OF BOARD OF STEWARDS

The gross receipts for the year 1929 show in the report as being \$7,565.72 as against \$7,473.20 for 1928 but included in the 1929 amount is the \$500.00 received for land sold to the Town of Stellarton. While the actual receipts placed to current account for 1929 was \$256.40 less than in 1928, and if the subscription list in back of report is examined carefully by the members of the congregation they will see that the amount will likely be much larger this year, unless a more generous response is made by those who are not now contributing or only in small amounts, as we have lost several families by removal to other places, and some members by death who were generous contributors to the church. The Treasurer's report shows a very small balance carried forward into this year which may very easily be turned into a deficit unless every member of the congregation makes an effort to contribute regularly and generously.
